
By Mr. Asiaf of Brockton, petition of Peter George Asiaf and others that provision be made for non-partisan nominations and elections for members of the school committee in the city of Brockton. Cities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR NON-PARTISAN NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE IN THE CITY OF BROCKTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter one hundred and
2 twenty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty, provid-
3 ing for party nominations for elected municipal officers in the
4 city of Brockton, shall not be applicable to the nomination
5 and election of members of the school committee of said city.
6 Non-partisan nominations and elections shall be held for candi-
7 dates seeking office as members of the school committee.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the registered voters
2 of said city at the biennial state election in the current year in
3 the form of the following question which shall be placed on the
4 official ballot at said election:—"Shall an act passed by the
5 General Court in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-two,
6 entitled, 'An Act providing for non-partisan nominations and
7 elections for members of the school committee in the city of
8 Brockton', be accepted?" If a majority of the votes cast on
9 said question is in the affirmative, this act shall take full effect
10 for the purposes of each biennial municipal election in said city
11 thereafter, but not otherwise.
