

By Mr. Hahn of Stoughton (by request), petition of Daniel D. Avery, Jr., for an investigation by the State Boxing Commission of certain changes in the rules and regulations governing boxing. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A STUDY BY THE STATE BOXING COMMISSION RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CHANGES IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING BOXING WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the state boxing commission is hereby author-
2 ized and directed to study the feasibility of making the following
3 changes in the rules and regulations of said commission as pres-
4 ently applied in this commonwealth:—

5 1. Non-residents seeking a license as a manager, boxer, sec-
6 ond, or trainer must hold a comparable license in their home state.

7 2. Require that schedules for each and every boxing match
8 shall be filed at the office of the commission at least seven days
9 before said match.

10 3. Require that a boxer is entitled to his purse if he is present
11 and able to contest, unless he has received notice forty-eight
12 hours before said match that the program has been changed.

13 4. Require that in championship matches the participants
14 must reside within the commonwealth at least seven consecutive
15 days before the match, all other participants must be in the
16 commonwealth at least twenty-four hours before their match.

17 Said commission shall report to the general court the results
18 of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any,
19 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said recom-
20 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the
21 house of representatives on or before the last Wednesday of
22 December in the current year.
