In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT REQUIRING THAT ALL TRAILERS, EXCEPT SEMITRAILERS, BE FASTENED BY SAFETY CHAINS TO THE TOWING VEHICLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended, is
2 hereby further amended by adding at the end the following
3 paragraph:—

4 Every trailer, except a semitrailer, shall, in addition to a regu-
5 lar hitch, be fastened by safety chains to prevent it from break-
6 ing away from the towing vehicle. Such chains shall comply
7 with such minimum standards for construction and performance
8 as the registrar may prescribe.
