HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, March 15, 1962.

The committee on Taxation, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 867) of Joseph E. Brett for a limited exemption from taxation of real property of totally disabled veterans of World War I; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 868) of Thaddeus Buczko, John T. Berry and another for legislation to provide real estate tax exemptions for certain World War I veterans; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1035) of John J. Sheehan for legislation to provide a certain real estate tax exemption for World War I veterans who are over the age of sixty-five and whose income does not exceed thirty-eight hundred dollars annually; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1452) of the Massachusetts Police Association that pensions paid to police officers of the Metropolitan District Commission and the Department of Public Safety be exempt from the income tax; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1896) of John P. Kennedy exempting from taxation the income from an annuity or pension paid on account of service in the metropolitan district police department; the petition (accompanied by order, House, No. 1898) of the Massachusetts League of Cities and Towns for a study by the Legislative Research Council relative to the taxation of trailers, trailer parks and mobile homes; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2615) of James R. McIntyre that certain annuities and pensions payable to police officers of the Metropolitan District Commission be exempt from taxation, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 3470).

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ON TAXATION.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, known as the
2 special commission on taxation, established by chapter eighty-
3 six of the resolves of nineteen hundred and forty-eight and most
4 recently revived and further continued by chapter eighteen of
5 the resolves of nineteen hundred and sixty-one, shall, in the
6 course of its investigation and study, consider the subject matter
7 of current house documents numbered 867, relative to providing
8 for a limited exemption from taxation of real property of totally
9 disabled veterans of World War I; 868, relative to providing a
10 certain real estate tax exemption to certain World War I vet-
11 erans; 1035, relative to providing a certain real estate tax ex-
12 emption to certain World War I veterans; 1452, relative to
13 excluding pensions paid to police officers of the metropolitan
14 district commission and state police officers from the income
15 taxes; 1896, relative to exempting from taxation the income
16 from an annuity or pension paid on account of service in the
17 metropolitan district police department; of the study proposed
18 by current house document numbered 1898, relative to the
19 taxation of trailers, trailer parks and mobile homes; and of
20 current house document numbered 2615, relative to exempting
21 certain annuities and pensions from taxation.
