AN ACT EXTENDING THE PROVISIONS OF THE OVERTIME COMPENSATION LAW, SO CALLED, TO COVER CERTAIN EMPLOYEES NOT SUBJECT THERETO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1A of chapter 151 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out clause (14), as appearing in chapter 431
3 of the acts of 1961, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 clause: — (14) as a service employee in a restaurant who regu-
5 larly receives gratuities.
