RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF THOMAS J. GREEHAN, DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE.

Whereas, The House of Representatives learns with sorrow of the death of Thomas J. Greehan of Belmont, the Director of Civil Service since 1944; and

Whereas, Thomas J. Greehan, a loyal, capable and dedicated public servant, continuously served the Commonwealth in several capacities since his first appointment in 1916 as chief clerk in the Department of Education until his untimely death on April 3rd, 1962; and

Whereas, During his long and distinguished career, he was honored many times by various organizations, having been president of the Boston Chapter of the American Society of Public Administration and president of the Eastern Regional Conference of the Civil Service Assembly of the United States and Canada; and

Whereas, The passing of this public spirited citizen, who was admired by those with whom he came in contact both for his knowledge and understanding, is a great loss to his community and the Commonwealth; therefore be it

Resolved, That the House of Representatives hereby expresses its regrets and extends its deepest sympathy to the family of the deceased upon the great loss that has come to them; and be it further

Resolved, That an engrossed copy of these resolutions be forwarded by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the family of the late Thomas J. Greehan.
