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## R E P O R T .

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By a vote of the town, passed at their last Annual Meeting, the financial year was to terminate on the first day of February, one month earlier than heretofore. At that time it was found impossible to make a Report containing any satisfactory information as to the expenditure of the appropriations for the year. This, we think, will be sufficiently apparent from the fact, that, since that date, there has been paid from the treasury the sum of one thousand four hundred and three dollars, on eighty-four different orders. These payments very nearly complete the accounts of highway, poor, and school expenditures, and of the miscellaneous expenses of the town, except the bills of those town officers whose duties are not completed till the time of the Annual Meeting.

Besides, during the early part of February, we were engaged in other duties, connected with the attempt to fill the town's quota of volunteers, and when it became possible for us to attend to making up a Report, the full year had nearly expired.

Under these circumstances we have thought it best not to change, at this time, the date of our Report.

## FINANCIAL CONDITION OF THE TOWN.

In consequence of the unusual expenditures for bounties to volunteers, and for other purposes incident to the existing war, the Town, on the first day of March, 1863, had incurred a debt of about \$6,800. This sum, in addition to the amount necessary for ordinary expenditures, was, in accordance with a unanimous vote of the Town, assessed upon the polls and estates liable to taxation on the first day of May last.

Of the whole amount of the tax-list committed to the Collector, (\$16,776.35.) there has been abated, on taxes and school-books, \$24.86; there remains due, from absentees, \$7.12, and the residue has been collected.

This statement indicates, as we think, a diligence on the part of the Collector, and a promptness on the part of tax-payers, without a precedent or parallel. If there are other towns which have met the exigencies of the year with equal promptness, the fact has not come to our knowledge.

There is cash in the treasury, \$865.36; there is due from the town of Plymouth, in reimbursement of bounties, \$700; making an available balance of \$1,565.36. Of this amount we estimate that \$400 will be necessary to meet existing demands, and for recruiting expenses (to be reimbursed by the State); \$200 for the repair of the Town House (deferred from last year); and the remainder for the payments to families of volunteers, before the tenth day of October, at which time we recommend that the taxes be made payable. For the payment of teachers' wages, falling due prior to that time, the Treasurer may have to resort to temporary loans, in anticipation of the taxes. As the circumstances which, last year, seemed to many to warrant a reduction of the appropriation for schools, no longer exist, we think the town may, profitably and conveniently, renew the appropriation of previous years.

There is due to the Town, from the State, for money ad-

vanced in aid of the families of volunteers, \$2,281.27. A portion of this sum (\$1,937.27) will be payable on the first day of December next; but while the payment of State aid is continued, we think it not advisable to treat this as available for ordinary town purposes, and we have not so considered it in making our estimates for the year.

We recommend that there be raised by taxation, the current year, the following sums, viz:—
