## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety.

### AN ACT

Providing for the Completion of Unfinished Business by Trial Justices upon expiration of their Commissions, without renewal, by resignation or otherwise.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whenever the commission of a  
2 trial justice shall expire without renewal, or be  
3 terminated by resignation, change of domicil, or  
4 revocation, such trial justice may finish any busi-  
5 ness begun or pending before him, and may cer-  
6 tify copies of his records and papers. Or the  
7 plaintiff in any civil action begun or pending  
8 before such trial justice may enter or transfer  
9 such action for proceedings before any other trial  
10 justice for the same county in the manner pro-  
11 vided in the case of the death of a trial justice  
12 before whom a civil action is begun or is pending.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
