AN ACT

To prevent Persons from Unlawfully Using or Wearing the Badges of the Sons of Veterans and Woman's Relief Corps.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Whoever shall wilfully wear or use the insignia
2 of the Sons of Veterans or the insignia of the
3 Woman's Relief Corps, for the purpose of repre-
4 senting that he is a member of either order, unless
5 he shall be a member of the order whose insignia
6 he shall so wear or use, shall be punished by fine
7 not exceeding twenty dollars or by imprison-
8 ment in the house of correction not exceeding
9 thirty days, or by both such fine and imprison-
10 ment.
