RESOLVE

Providing for Repairs to a School-house in the Town of
Gay Head.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth, to the selectmen of the
3 town of Gay Head, the sum of one hundred dollars, to
4 be expended in making certain necessary repairs on the
5 school-house in the town of Gay Head, which school-
6 house was erected by the Commonwealth upon Indian
7 lands, within the limits of said town, prior to its incorpo-
8 ration.
