RESOLVE

To provide for Refunding Certain Taxes Assessed Against
the Waltham Savings Bank.

1 *Resolved*, That the Waltham savings bank shall be
2 reimbursed for the following amounts paid by it into
3 the treasury of the Commonwealth in excess of the tax
4 required by law, and in consequence of omission to
5 specify certain non-taxable bonds held by said bank as
6 an investment in the returns given for purposes of taxa-
7 tion, to wit: the sum of one hundred forty-one dollars
8 and twenty-three cents of the tax paid by said bank for
9 the six months ending on the first day of November, in
10 the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and the
11 further sum of two hundred and fifty dollars of the tax
12 paid for the six months ending on the first day of May,
13 in the year eighteen hundred and ninety; upon applica-
14 tion to the auditor of the Commonwealth, who on satis-
15 factory proof that said amounts were paid in excess of
16 the required tax, shall certify the same to the governor
17 and council, in the same manner as other claims against
18 the Commonwealth.
