

HOUSE No. 549.

[Mr. McERRICK of Boston gives notice that he will move to substitute this bill for the bill relating to the management of boarding-houses at the State Normal School, Senate No. 221.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-one.

AN ACT

Relating to Certain Receipts and Disbursements at
the State Normal Schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows :*

1 SECTION 1. The running expenses of the board-
2 ing-houses of the state normal schools shall be
3 paid from the treasury of the Commonwealth, and
4 all receipts for board, and receipts arising from
5 any other sources in the conducting of such
6 boarding-houses, shall be paid over as often as
7 once each month to the treasurer of the Common-
8 wealth. Said boarding-houses shall be under the
9 general management of the state board of educa-

tion, and board, including all expenses except repairs and furnishings, shall be supplied to students at such sum as shall not exceed the actual cost.

SECT. 2. All bills for boarding-house expenses shall be properly scheduled and approved in the case of each school by a majority of the visitors thereof, and after having received the further approval of the secretary of the state board of education shall be presented to the auditor of the Commonwealth, who shall certify them to the governor and council in the same manner as other claims against the Commonwealth. The accounts at each school, showing receipts and disbursements in the management of the boarding-house, shall be kept under the direction of the auditor of the Commonwealth; and the auditor shall, as provided by chapter eighty-seven of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, in case of accounts of other state institutions, prescribe the number and form of all analytical and subsidiary accounts to be made from the accounts of record kept at each school. Estimates for the support of said boarding-houses shall be embraced in the annual estimates of the auditor.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
