## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-one.

### AN ACT

To change the Name of the Trustees of the Memorial Hospital in Worcester.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The trustees of the memorial  
2 hospital, incorporated by chapter eighty-seven of  
3 the acts of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-  
4 one, shall hereafter be called and known as the  
5 memorial hospital, and in that name shall con-  
6 tinue to hold, possess and use all the property,  
7 and be entitled to all the rights powers and  
8 franchises of said corporation, and be subject to  
9 all its duties and obligations in the same manner  
10 and to the same extent as if this act had not been  
11 passed.

1 SECT. 2. All the officers of said corporation  
2 shall continue to hold and exercise the powers

3 and duties of their respective offices in the same  
4 manner they would, or could have done, had not  
5 the name of said corporation been changed.

1   SECT. 3. Nothing contained in this act shall  
2 be construed as a surrender or forfeiture of any  
3 of the property or rights of property, or any of  
4 the powers, privileges or rights of said corpora-  
5 tion.

1   SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
