RESOLVE

Providing against Depredations by the Insect known as the
Ocneria Dispar or Gypsy Moth.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth, a sum not exceeding fifty
3 thousand dollars, which sum may be expended under the
4 direction of the state board of agriculture, in continuing
5 the work of exterminating the insect known as the
6 *ocneria dispar* or gypsy moth, as provided for in chapter
7 two hundred and ten of the acts of the present year.
8 The above sum shall be in addition to any sum of money
9 heretofore authorized.
