In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-four.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Expenses in Connection with the Prisons of the Commonwealth and certain other Reformatory Expenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four,
7 to wit:—

8 For travelling expenses of the commission-
9 ers of prisons, and of the secretary and agents of
10 said commissioners, a sum not exceeding twenty-
11 five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219;
12 Acts 1887, chap. 315.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$2,500.)

13 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
14 commissioners of prisons, a sum not exceeding
15 twelve hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$1,200.)

16 For expenses incurred in removing prisoners to
17 and from state and county prisons, a sum not
18 exceeding nine hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
19 chap. 219; Acts 1884, chap. 255; 1890, chaps.
20 180 and 278.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$900.)

21 For aiding prisoners discharged from the
22 Massachusetts reformatory at Concord, a sum not
23 exceeding five thousand dollars. [Acts 1884,
24 chap. 255; 1887, chap. 395.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$5,000.)

25 For the salary of the agent for aiding prisoners
26 discharged from the state prison at Boston, the
27 sum of one thousand dollars; and for expenses of
28 said agent, a sum not exceeding three thousand
29 dollars, to be used in rendering assistance to said
30 prisoners. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219, sect. 26.]

31 For expenses of the agent for aiding discharged
32 female prisoners discharged from the prisons of
33 the Commonwealth, including assistance rendered
34 to said prisoners, a sum not exceeding three
35 thousand dollars. [Acts 1888, chap. 417.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$3,000.)

36 For travelling and other necessary expenses of
37 the trustees of the state primary and reform
38 schools, a sum not exceeding one thousand dol-
39 lars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 89, sect. 1.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$1,000.)

40 For the support of Sarah J. Robinson, a
41 prisoner in the jail at Lowell, in the county of
42 Middlesex, a sum not exceeding four hundred
43 dollars. [Res. 1889, chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$400.)

44 For the compensation of probation officers, as
45 authorized by section seven of chapter three hun-
46 dred and fifty-six of the acts of the year eighteen
47 hundred and ninety-one, a sum not exceeding six
48 hundred dollars.

(No appropriation 1893.)

49 For expenses incurred in the arrest of fugitives
50 from justice, a sum not exceeding two thousand
51 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 218.]

(Appropriation 1893, \$2,000.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
