Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-four.

AN ACT

Concerning Registers of Voters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The secretary of the Commonwealth shall
2 provide every city and town with two or more revolving
3 adjustable registers for every polling place. Said regis-
4 ters shall be approved by the secretary, treasurer and
5 auditor of the Commonwealth, or a majority of them,
6 shall have substantial cases and secure fastenings, and
7 a standard capacity of nine hundred names. Said regis-
8 ters shall be purchased by the secretary at a price not
9 exceeding fifteen dollars each, unless those of different
10 capacity are provided, and if so at a price approved by
11 the secretary, treasurer and auditor, and shall be paid
12 for out of the treasury of the Commonwealth.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
