AN ACT

Relative to the Duties of Registers of Probate and Insolvency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section ten of chapter one hundred and
2 fifty-eight of the Public Statutes is hereby amended by
3 adding at the end thereof the following words: "He may
4 issue all warrants, letters and licenses, and may appoint
5 appraisers to make any inventory required to be returned
6 to said courts," so as to read as follows:—

7 *Section 10.* He may issue process of attachment and
8 of execution, and all other proper processes necessary to
9 carry into effect any order or decree of his courts, and
10 the same may run into any county, and shall be executed
11 and obeyed throughout the state. He may issue all
12 warrants, letters and licenses, and may appoint appraisers
13 to make any inventory required to be returned to said
14 courts.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
