AN ACT

In Relation to the Construction of a New Iron Span in place of the Westerly Span of the Rocks Bridge, which crosses the Merrimac River between the City of Haverhill and the Town of West Newbury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners for Essex
2 county are hereby authorized and required, within one
3 year after the passage of this act, to construct and place
4 a new iron span, with suitable abutment, in place of the
5 westerly span and abutment now situate across the Rocks
6 bridge, which crosses the Merrimac river between the
7 city of Haverhill and the town of West Newbury. The
8 cost of said span shall be paid by the county of Essex,
9 and said commissioners are authorized to borrow such
10 sums of money on the credit of said county as may be
11 necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
