AN ACT

Relative to Gaming and the Illegal Keeping and Sale of
Intoxicating Liquor by Incorporated Clubs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whenever any person is convicted of ex-
2 posing and keeping for sale or selling intoxicating liquor
3 on the premises occupied by any club or organization
4 described in section two of chapter one hundred and
5 fifteen of the Public Statutes, or of illegal gaming upon
6 said premises, or of being present where implements of
7 gaming are found upon said premises, the selectmen of
8 the town, or the mayor and the aldermen of the city,
9 except in the city of Boston the board of police, within
10 such town or city where such club or organization is
11 situated, shall immediately notify the secretary of the
12 Commonwealth, and he shall, upon receipt of such notice,
13 declare the charter of said club void; and the secretary
14 of the Commonwealth shall publish a notice, in at least
15 one newspaper published in the county where said club
16 or organization is situated, that such incorporation is void
17 and of no further effect.

1 SECT. 2. Section two of chapter four hundred and
2 thirty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
3 ninety, as amended by section two of chapter two hun-
4 dred and twenty-six of the acts of the year eighteen
5 hundred and ninety-three, is hereby repealed, but such
6 repeal shall not affect any proceedings now pending or
7 any liability heretofore incurred.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
