

SENATE No. 348.

[Introduced on leave by Senator SHAW of Middlesex.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-four.

RESOLVE

Providing for the Publication of Certain Special Laws.

1 *Resolved*, That the special acts of this Commonwealth
2 passed from the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine
3 to the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, inclusive,
4 be collated and published under the direction of the sec-
5 retary of the Commonwealth, in a volume as nearly as
6 may be in conformity with the volume of special laws
7 last printed.

1 *Resolved*, That fifteen hundred copies of the volume
2 aforesaid shall be printed and shall be distributed as fol-
3 lows: one hundred copies for the use of the various state
4 offices and committee rooms and the two houses of the
5 legislature; one copy to each member of the present
6 general court; one copy to each of the judges of the
7 supreme judicial and superior courts and each judge of
8 probate and insolvency; two hundred copies for the state

9 library, six copies of which shall be preserved upon the
10 shelves, and the residue used in exchanges; one copy to
11 each city and town in the Commonwealth, to be placed
12 in the city or town library, when such library exists;
13 one copy to each public and incorporated library in the
14 Commonwealth, other than a city or town library; one
15 copy to each registry of deeds; one copy to the clerk of
16 the courts in each county; fifty copies to be retained in
17 the office of the secretary of the Commonwealth; and the
18 remaining copies to be disposed of by the secretary of
19 the Commonwealth to individual purchasers at cost, the
20 money received therefor to be paid into the treasury of
21 the Commonwealth: *provided*, that no copies shall be
22 sold for the purposes of re-sale. The secretary shall cause
23 to be pasted on the inside of the cover of each copy de-
24 livered by him to any public officer, for the use of his
25 office, a paper describing said fact, and that such copy is
26 to be transmitted by the present incumbent, at the ex-
27 piration of his term of office, to his successor in such
28 office.
