AN ACT

Relative to the Pensioning of Employees of the City of
Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Any person who has been employed for
2 twenty consecutive years as a common laborer by the
3 city of Boston shall, if such person so requests, be retired
4 from active service and placed upon the pension roll of
5 said city. The pension paid to persons so retired shall
6 be determined by the city council of said city, but shall
7 not be less than half the compensation paid to such per-
8 son at the time of retirement.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its accept-
2 ance by the city council of the city of Boston.
