### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Sundry Charitable Expenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropri-  
2 ated to be paid out of the treasury of the Com-  
3 monwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the  
4 purposes specified, to meet sundry charitable ex-  
5 penses for the year ending on the thirty-first day  
6 of December, in the year eighteen hundred and  
7 ninety-five, to wit:—

#### STATE BOARD OF LUNACY AND CHARITY.

8 For expenses of the state board of lunacy and  
9 charity, including travelling and other expenses of  
10 members, necessary legal expenses, and salary and  
11 expenses of the clerk and auditor of said board, a  
12 sum not exceeding forty-seven hundred and fifty  
13 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$4,750.)

14 For salaries and expenses in the department  
15 of the in-door poor, a sum not exceeding forty-  
16 five thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$43,000.)

17 For salaries and expenses in the department of  
18 out-door poor, a sum not exceeding twenty-four  
19 thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$24,000.)

20 For salaries and expenses in the department of  
21 the inspector of institutions, a sum not exceeding  
22 ten thousand five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,  
23 chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$10,500.)

24 For travelling and other necessary expenses of  
25 the auxiliary visitors of the state board of lunacy  
26 and charity, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred  
27 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$1,500.)

#### MISCELLANEOUS CHARITABLE.

28 For the transportation of state paupers, a sum  
29 not exceeding twenty thousand dollars. [Pub.  
30 Stat., chap. 79; Acts 1887, chap. 367.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$20,000.)

31 For the support and relief of state paupers in  
32 state lunatic hospitals and asylums of the Com-  
33 monwealth, and of state lunatic paupers boarded  
34 out in families, for the present and previous years,  
35 a sum not exceeding one hundred and eighty thou-  
36 sand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 87, sects. 31, 32  
37 and 35; Acts, 1885, chap. 385.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$185,000.)

38 The reimbursement of expenses incurred by  
39 certain towns in the maintenance of the insane,

40 as provided for in chapter two hundred and forty-  
41 three of the acts of the year eighteen hundred  
42 and ninety-two, shall be paid from the appropri-  
43 tion for the support of state lunatic paupers, and  
44 any unpaid bills of previous years may be paid  
45 from the appropriation of the present year.

46 For expenses attending the management of  
47 cases of settlement and bastardy, a sum not ex-  
48 ceeding one thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat.,  
49 chaps. 85, 86 and 87; sects. 2, 35 and 32.]

50 For the care and maintenance of indigent and  
51 neglected children and juvenile offenders, a sum  
52 not exceeding sixty thousand dollars. [Acts  
53 1882, chap. 181, sects. 2 and 3. Acts 1893,  
54 chap. 252.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$55,500.)

55 For the support of state paupers in the Massa-  
56 chusetts school for the feeble minded and the  
57 hospital cottages for children at Baldwinsville, a  
58 sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars. [Acts  
59 1886, chap. 298; 1889, chap. 230.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$10,000.)

60 For the support of sick state paupers by cities  
61 and towns, for the present and previous years,  
62 the same to include cases of wife settlement, a  
63 sum not exceeding seventy thousand dollars.  
64 [Pub. Stat., chap. 86, sect. 26.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$75,000.)

65 For the burial of state paupers by cities and  
66 towns, for the present and previous years, a sum  
67 not exceeding eight thousand dollars. [Pub.  
68 Stat., chap. 84, sect. 17; Acts 1890, chap. 71.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$10,000.)

69 For temporary aid for state paupers and ship-  
70 wrecked seamen, by cities and towns, for the  
71 present and previous years, a sum not exceeding  
72 thirty thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 84,  
73 sect. 18; Acts 1886, chap. 179.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$30,000.)

74 For the support and transportation of unsettled  
75 pauper infants in this Commonwealth, including  
76 infants in infant asylums, a sum not exceeding  
77 twenty-five thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap.  
78 86, sects. 44, 46 and 47; Acts, 1883, chap. 232.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$30,000.)

79 For expenses incurred in connection with small-  
80 pox and other diseases dangerous to the public  
81 health, for the present and previous years, a sum  
82 not exceeding five thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat.,  
83 chaps. 80 and 86, sects. 83, 25 and 26; Acts,  
84 1885, chap. 211.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$15,000.)

85 For travelling and other necessary expenses  
86 of the trustees of the Medfield Insane Asylum,  
87 to include office rents, clerk hires and telephones,  
88 a sum not exceeding three thousand and twenty-  
89 five dollars. [Acts 1892, chap. 425; Res. 1856,  
90 chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$2,500.)

91 For fees for medical examiners, a sum not ex-  
92 ceeding five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap.  
93 26; Acts 1887, chap. 310.]

(Appropriation 1894, \$500.)

94 For annuities due from the Commonwealth,  
95 incurred by the acceptance of the bequest of the  
96 late Martha Johonnot, a sum not exceeding four

97 hundred dollars. [Res. 1841, chap. 65; 1843,  
98 chap. 43.]

(Appropriation, 1894, \$400.)

99 For annuities to soldiers and others as author-  
100 ized by the legislature, the sum of thirty-one  
101 hundred and twenty-eight dollars. Res. 1874,  
102 chap. 831; 1876, chap. 14; 1885, chaps. 41 and 44;  
103 1886, chap. 28; 1887, chaps. 83 and 89; 1889,  
104 chap. 52; 1891, chap. 34; 1892, chaps. 8, 53, 56,  
105 66, 81 and 102; 1893, chaps. 5, 13 and 41; 1894,  
106 chaps. 11, 24, 53 and 60.]

107 For pensions, the sum of five hundred and  
108 twenty dollars. [Res. 1869, chap. 83; 1870,
