AN ACT

To Prevent the Misuse of Animals for Advertising Purposes

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. That it shall be deemed unlawful for any
2 person residing in, or stopping temporarily within the
3 boundaries of this Commonwealth, to put upon or shall
4 cause to have put upon any game, fowl, or any animal
5 for advertising purposes any of the wearing apparel or
6 semblance thereof worn by human beings. It shall be
7 further deemed unlawful to paint upon the skin, or
8 natural coating of any animal, fowl or game any adver-
9 tising sign.

1 SECT. 2. Whoever violates this law shall be fined a
2 sum not exceeding one hundred dollars or less than
3 twenty dollars for each offence.
