RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Hampshire.

1 *Resolved*, That the county commissioners for the
2 county of Hampshire are hereby authorized to levy as
3 the county tax of said county for the current year in the
4 manner provided by law the sum of forty-eight thousand
5 dollars, to be expended for the following purposes, to
6 wit:—

7 For the annual instalment on the county debt, a sum
8 not exceeding eight thousand dollars.

9 For interest, a sum not exceeding four thousand two
10 hundred dollars.

11 For criminal costs, a sum not exceeding two thousand
12 dollars.

13 For salaries of county commissioners, a sum not
14 exceeding one thousand six hundred dollars.

15 For the clerk of courts, a sum not exceeding two
16 thousand three hundred dollars.

17 For the judge of the district court, a sum not exceed-
18 ing two thousand three hundred dollars.

19 For the clerk of the district court, a sum not exceed-
20 ing one thousand three hundred dollars.

21 For the sheriff, a sum not exceeding one thousand
22 dollars.

- 23 For the county treasurer, a sum not exceeding eight
24 hundred dollars.
- 25 For the jailer and master of the house of correction, a
26 sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.
- 27 For the turnkey, matron, physician and organist, a
28 sum not exceeding nine hundred dollars.
- 29 For the probation officer, a sum not exceeding six
30 hundred dollars.
- 31 For the messenger, a sum not exceeding eight hundred
32 dollars.
- 33 For clerical assistance, a sum not exceeding six hun-
34 dred dollars.
- 35 For deputy sheriffs attending court, a sum not exceed-
36 ing one thousand three hundred dollars.
- 37 For constables serving venires, a sum not exceeding
38 three hundred and fifty dollars.
- 39 For printing and advertising, a sum not exceeding one
40 thousand five hundred dollars.
- 41 For stationery, a sum not exceeding three hundred
42 dollars.
- 43 For fuel, lights and water, a sum not exceeding one
44 thousand four hundred dollars.
- 45 For medical examiners, a sum not exceeding four hun-
46 dred dollars.
- 47 For the law library, a sum not exceeding one thousand
48 dollars.
- 49 For indexing, a sum not exceeding one thousand two
50 hundred dollars.
- 51 For the jail and house of correction, a sum not exceed-
52 ing five thousand dollars.
- 53 For repairs on county buildings, a sum not exceeding
54 five hundred dollars.
- 55 For the care of county bridges, a sum not exceeding
56 one thousand dollars.

57 For surveying, a sum not exceeding one hundred
58 dollars.

59 For grand and traverse jurors, a sum not exceeding
60 four thousand five hundred dollars.

61 For land damages, a sum not exceeding one hundred
62 dollars.

63 For rent and postage, a sum not exceeding four hun-
64 dred dollars.

65 For insane cases, a sum not exceeding three hundred
66 dollars.

67 For special justices of the district court, a sum not
68 exceeding four hundred dollars.

69 For stenographers, a sum not exceeding four hundred
70 dollars.

71 For the truant school, a sum not exceeding two hun-
72 dred dollars.

73 For miscellaneous expenses, a sum not exceeding two
74 hundred and fifty dollars.
