### RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Hampden.

1 *Resolved*, That the county commissioners for the  
2 county of Hampden are hereby authorized to levy as  
3 the county tax of said county for the current year, in the  
4 manner provided by law, the sum of one hundred and  
5 thirty-five thousand dollars, to be expended for the  
6 following purposes, to wit: —

7 For the compensation of jurors, a sum not exceeding  
8 thirteen thousand five hundred dollars.

9 For the service of venires, a sum not exceeding four  
10 hundred dollars.

11 For officers of courts and meals of jurors, a sum not  
12 exceeding three thousand dollars.

13 For salaries and expenses of county and special com-  
14 missioners, a sum not exceeding two thousand six  
15 hundred dollars.

16 For salaries of the sheriff and treasurer, a sum not  
17 exceeding three thousand dollars.

18 For the stenographer, a sum not exceeding one thous-  
19 and dollars.

20 For land damages, a sum not exceeding five hundred  
21 dollars.

- 22 For the publication of commissioners' notices, a sum  
23 not exceeding two hundred dollars.
- 24 For surveys of highways, a sum not exceeding one  
25 thousand dollars.
- 26 For the construction of highways, a sum not exceeding  
27 five thousand dollars.
- 28 For medical examiners, a sum not exceeding one thous-  
29 and five hundred dollars.
- 30 For salaries of the messenger and engineer at the court  
31 house, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.
- 32 For clerk's assistants at the court house, a sum not ex-  
33 ceeding two thousand dollars.
- 34 For record books and stationery, a sum not exceeding  
35 one thousand five hundred dollars.
- 36 For indexing, a sum not exceeding one thousand dol-  
37 lars.
- 38 For the law library, a sum not exceeding one thou-  
39 sand five hundred dollars.
- 40 For repairs at the court house, a sum not exceeding  
41 four thousand dollars.
- 42 For fuel and lights at the court house, a sum not ex-  
43 ceeding one thousand four hundred dollars.
- 44 For the clerk of courts, a sum not exceeding three  
45 thousand five hundred dollars.
- 46 For miscellaneous expenses, a sum not exceeding one  
47 thousand dollars.
- 48 For interest on county notes, a sum not exceeding  
49 fifteen thousand dollars.
- 50 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceed-  
51 ing one thousand dollars.
- 52 For insane cases, a sum not exceeding one thousand  
53 five hundred dollars.
- 54 For the truant school, a sum not exceeding five thou-  
55 sand dollars, less receipts.

- 56 For salaries of officers of police and district courts, a  
57 sum not exceeding twelve thousand dollars.
- 58 For police court supplies, a sum not exceeding one  
59 thousand five hundred dollars.
- 60 For probation officers, a sum not exceeding three thou-  
61 sand two hundred dollars.
- 62 For the following expenses at the jail and house of  
63 correction : —
- 64 For provisions, a sum not exceeding seven thousand  
65 five hundred dollars.
- 66 For clothing, a sum not exceeding one thousand five  
67 hundred dollars.
- 68 For fuel and light, a sum not exceeding four thousand  
69 dollars.
- 70 For beds and bedding, a sum not exceeding four hun-  
71 dred dollars.
- 72 For salaries of officers, a sum not exceeding six thou-  
73 sand five hundred dollars.
- 74 For board of officers and employees, a sum not exceed-  
75 ing one thousand two hundred dollars.
- 76 For additions and repairs, a sum not exceeding two  
77 thousand dollars.
- 78 For instruction, a sum not exceeding three hundred  
79 dollars.
- 80 For furniture and utensils, a sum not exceeding three  
81 hundred dollars.
- 82 For miscellaneous expenses, a sum not exceeding one  
83 thousand dollars.
- 84 For water rents, a sum not exceeding six hundred dol-  
85 lars.
- 86 For medicine and medical attendance, a sum not ex-  
87 ceeding one thousand dollars.
- 88 For the reduction of the county debt, a sum not ex-  
89 ceeding thirty-five thousand dollars.
