### RESOLVE

Relative to the Dedication of the National Military Park on the Battlefields of Chickamauga and Chattanooga.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the  
2 treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding five  
3 thousand dollars, to be expended under the direction of  
4 the governor and council, to enable the Commonwealth  
5 to be properly represented at the dedication ceremonies  
6 to be held at Chickamauga, Georgia, and Chattanooga,  
7 Tennessee, in the month of September in the year eigh-  
8 teen hundred and ninety-five, through the following offi-  
9 cers: his excellency the governor and eight members of  
10 his staff, his honor the lieutenant-governor and three  
11 members of the executive council, the president of the  
12 senate, the speaker of the house, a special committee of  
13 four members of the senate and eleven members of the  
14 house, to be appointed by the presiding officer of the  
15 two branches, and a delegation of three members each  
16 from the second and thirty-third regiments of Massachu-  
17 setts volunteers, who were in said battles. Any vacan-  
18 cies occurring in the joint special committee may be  
19 filled by the presiding officer of the branch in the repre-  
20 sentation of which such vacancies occur.
