In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-six.

AN ACT

To Disqualify Certain Public Officers and Employees from Serving as Officers of Caucuses, Conventions and Political Committees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 No clerk, employee, commissioner, member of any
- 2 board, or other officer of any department or branch
- 3 of the civil service of the Commonwealth, or of any
- 4 county, city or town therein, except those elected by
- 5 popular vote, shall be an officer of any political caucus
- 6 or a member of any political committee or convention.
- 7 Whoever serves as an officer of a caucus, committee or
- 8 convention in violation of the provisions of this act shall
- 9 be fined not more than fifty dollars for each offence.
