AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses of
the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six,
7 to wit:—

8 For the salaries of the members of the state
9 board of arbitration and conciliation, six thousand
10 dollars. [Acts 1887, chap. 269; 1888, chap. 261.]
(Appropriation 1895, \$6,000.)

11 For the salary of the clerk of the state board of
12 arbitration and conciliation, twelve hundred dol-
13 lars. [Acts 1887, chap. 269; 1888, chap. 261.]
(Appropriation 1895, \$1,200.)

14 For travelling, incidental and contingent ex-
15 penses of the state board of arbitration and con-
16 ciliation, a sum not exceeding four thousand
17 dollars, which shall include the compensation of
18 expert assistants. [Acts 1886, chap. 263; 1887,
19 chap. 269; 1892, chap. 382; Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$4,600.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
