AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses of
the Civil Service Commission.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six,
7 to wit:—

8 For the compensation and expenses of the
9 members of the civil service commission, a sum
10 not exceeding two thousand dollars. [Acts 1884,
11 chap. 320; 1889, chaps. 177 and 351.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$2,000.)

12 For the salary of the chief examiner of the
13 civil service commission, three thousand dollars.
14 [Acts 1884, chap. 320; 1889, chaps. 177 and 351.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,000.)

15 For the salary of the secretary of the civil ser-
16 vice commission, two thousand dollars. [Acts
17 1884, chap. 320; 1889, chap. 177.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$2,000.)

18 For the salary of the registrar of labor of the
19 civil service commission, two thousand dollars.
20 [Acts 1895, chap. 376.]

(Paid from appropriation for clerical assistance in 1895.)

21 For clerical assistance, expenses of examina-
22 tions, printing civil service rules and regulations
23 and other information for the use of applicants,
24 printing, advertising and stationery, travelling
25 and incidental expenses of the chief examiner,
26 commissioners and secretary, and necessary office
27 expenses, a sum not exceeding eleven thousand

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
