AN ACT

Making appropriations for Salaries of Employees and other necessary Expenses in the Department of the Sergeant-at-Arms.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six,
7 to wit:—

8 For the salary of the chief engineer and other
9 employees in the engineer's department, a sum
10 not exceeding ninety-eight hundred dollars.
11 [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$9,800.)

12 For the salaries of the watchmen and assistant
13 watchmen, at the state house, a sum not exceed-
14 ing eleven thousand one hundred dollars. [Acts
15 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$10,200.)

16 For the salaries of firemen, oilers and cleaners
17 at the state house, a sum not exceeding ten thou-
18 sand four hundred dollars. [Acts 1895, chap.
19 284.]

(Appropriation, 1895, \$9,612.)

20 For the salaries of the elevator men and ex-
21 penses in connection with the elevators at the
22 state house, a sum not exceeding sixty-eight hun-
23 dred dollars. [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$6,800.)

24 For the salaries of the gardener and porters at
25 the state house, a sum not exceeding four thou-
26 sand four hundred dollars. [Acts 1895, chap.
27 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,900.)

28 For rent of telephones and expenses in connec-
29 tion therewith at the state house, a sum not ex-
30 ceeding thirty-seven hundred and twenty-five
31 dollars. [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,500.)

32 For fuel and lights, at the state house, includ-
33 ing coal, water, gas and removal of ashes, a
34 sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.
35 [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$37,500.)

36 For the care of the state house and grounds,
37 which provides for repairs, furniture and repairs,
38 and such expenses as may be necessary at num-
39 bers five and six Mount Vernon street, now oc-
40 cupied by state departments, a sum not exceed-
41 ing twenty-five thousand dollars. [Acts 1895,
42 chap. 284.]

43 For the salary of the messengers to the ser-
44 geant-at-arms, known as "sergeant-at-arms mes-
45 sengers," including an office boy, a sum not
46 exceeding forty-seven hundred dollars. [Res.
47 1895, chap. 115; Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$4,800.)

48 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
49 sergeant-at-arms, a sum not exceeding three hun-
50 dred dollars. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$300.)

51 For the salary of the stenographer of the
52 sergeant-at-arms, a sum not exceeding eight
53 hundred dollars. [Acts, 1895, chap. 284; Res.
54 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$800.)

55 For the salary of the state house matron, a sum
56 not exceeding eight hundred dollars. [Acts
57 1895, chap. 284; Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$800.)

58 For the salary of the janitor at the Common-
59 wealth building, a sum not exceeding nine hun-
60 dred dollars. [Acts 1887, chap. 128; 1895, chap.
61 284.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$900.)

62 For repairs, improvements, furniture and other
63 necessary expenses at the Commonwealth build-
64 ing, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.
65 [Acts 1882, chap. 262; 1884, chap. 14; 1887,
66 chap. 128; 1895, chap. 284; Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation, 1895, \$5,000.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
