RESOLVE

Instructing the Metropolitan Park Commission and the State Board of Health to report in print the Condition of the Charles River.

1 *Resolved*, That the joint board consisting of the Metro-
2 politan park commission and the state board of health be
3 instructed to report in print upon the condition of the
4 Charles river and its banks, from the line between
5 Waltham and Watertown and Mother Brook in Dedham,
6 as required by chapter five hundred and twenty-nine of
7 the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four,
8 and to have printed and bound in cloth two thousand
9 copies of said report, five hundred copies to be for the
10 use of the legislature, five hundred copies for the use of
11 the joint board and the balance to be distributed under
12 direction of the secretary of the Commonwealth.
