RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Barnstable.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the county commissioners for the
2 county of Barnstable are hereby authorized to levy as
3 the county tax of said county for the current year, in
4 the manner provided by law, the sum of twenty-four
5 thousand dollars, to be expended for the following pur-
6 poses, to wit: —
- 7 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding one
8 thousand dollars.
- 9 For reduction of county debt, a sum not exceeding
10 nine hundred dollars.
- 11 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by
12 law, a sum not exceeding five thousand three hundred
13 and fifty dollars.
- 14 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,
15 a sum not exceeding three thousand five hundred dollars.
- 16 For salaries of jailers and masters and assistants and
17 support of prisoners in jails and houses of correction, in
18 excess of receipts, a sum not exceeding three thousand
19 one hundred dollars.
- 20 For criminal costs in the superior court, in excess of
21 receipts, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

22 For civil expenses in supreme and superior courts, a
23 sum not exceeding one thousand eight hundred dollars.

24 For transportation expenses of county and special
25 commissioners, a sum not exceeding three hundred
26 dollars.

27 For medical examiners, inquests and commitment of
28 the insane, a sum not exceeding seven hundred dollars.

29 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceed-
30 ing one hundred dollars.

31 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-
32 ings, a sum not exceeding one thousand nine hundred
33 dollars.

34 For care, fuel, lights and supplies in county buildings,
35 other than jails and houses of correction, a sum not ex-
36 ceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars.

37 For highways, bridges and land damages, in excess of
38 receipts, a sum not exceeding one thousand five hundred
39 dollars.

40 For clerical assistance in county offices, in excess of
41 receipts, a sum not exceeding four hundred and fifty
42 dollars.

43 For truant schools, in excess of receipts, a sum not
44 exceeding two hundred dollars.

45 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses, in excess
46 of receipts, a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty
47 dollars.
