RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Essex.

- Resolved, That the county commissioners for the
- 2 county of Essex are hereby authorized to levy as the
- 3 county tax of said county for the current year, in the
- 4 manner provided by law, the sum of two hundred and
- 5 twenty-five thousand dollars, to be expended for the fol-
- 6 lowing purposes, to wit: -
- 7 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding four
- 8 thousand five hundred dollars.
- 9 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by
- 10 law, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand four hun-
- 11 dred dollars.
- 12 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,
- 13 a sum not exceeding thirty-three thousand five hundred
- 14 dollars.
- 15 For salaries of jailers, masters and assistants, and
- 16 support of prisoners in jails and houses of correction, in
- 17 excess of receipts, a sum not exceeding forty-three thou-
- 18 sand dollars.
- 19 For criminal costs in superior court, in excess of
- 20 receipts, a sum not exceeding twenty-one thousand
- 21 five hundred dollars.

- 22 For civil expenses in supreme and superior courts, a
- 23 sum not exceeding sixteen thousand five hundred dol-
- 24 lars.
- 25 For trial justices, a sum not exceeding four thousand
- 26 dollars.
- 27 For transportation expenses of county and special
- 28 commissioners, a sum not exceeding five hundred dol-
- 29 lars.
- 30 For medical examiners, inquests and commitment of
- 31 the insane, a sum not exceeding eight thousand five
- 32 hundred dollars.
- 33 For auditors, masters and referees, a sum not exceed-
- 34 ing three thousand dollars.
- 35 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-
- 36 ings, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.
- 37 For care, tuel, lights and supplies in county buildings,
- 38 other than jails and houses of correction, a sum not
- 39 exceeding twelve thousand dollars.
- 40 For highways, bridges and land damages, in excess of
- 41 receipts, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.
- 42 For clerical assistance in county offices, in excess of
- 43 receipts, a sum not exceeding five thousand six hundred
- 44 dollars.
- 45 For law libraries, a sum not exceeding two thousand
- 46 dollars.
- 47 For truant schools, in excess of receipts, a sum not
- 48 exceeding five thousand dollars.
- 49 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses, in excess
- 50 of receipts, a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars.
