AN ACT

To amend an Act relative to the Licensing and Regulating
of Stables in Cities.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and
2 thirteen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-five is hereby amended by striking out in the
4 second line thereof the word "fifty," and inserting in
5 place thereof the word "twenty-five," so that said sec-
6 tion, as amended, will read as follows:—

7 "Section 1. No person shall hereafter erect, occupy
8 or use for a stable any building in any city whose popu-
9 lation exceeds twenty-five thousand, unless first licensed
10 so to do by the board of health of said city, and in such
11 case only to the extent so licensed."

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
