AN ACT

To incorporate the Manufacturers' Agricultural Society in North Attleborough.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. George H. French, Elton I.
2 Franklin, William H. Riley, William W. Sher-
3 man and John W. Wolfenden, Sidney O. Bag-
4 ney, their associates and successors within the
5 towns of Attleborough, Wrentham, Foxborough,
6 Rehoboth, Franklin, Mansfield, Norton and North
7 Attleborough, are hereby made a corporation
8 under the name of the Manufacturers' agricultural
9 society located in North Attleborough, for the
10 encouragement of agriculture, horticulture and
11 the arts, by premiums and other means, with all
12 the powers and privileges, and subject to all the
13 duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in all
14 the general laws which now are or may hereafter

15 be in force applicable to such corporations: *pro-*
16 *vided*, said corporation shall not be deprived of any
17 bounty from the Commonwealth by the existence
18 of the North Attleborough agricultural society.
19 The capital stock of said corporation shall not
20 exceed thirty thousand dollars, to be divided into
21 shares of twenty-five dollars each; and said cor-
22 poration is hereby authorized to hold, by purchase,
23 gift, devise or otherwise, real and personal estate
24 to an amount not exceeding thirty thousand dol-
25 lars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
