AN ACT

Relative to Grounds for the Parade, Drill and Target
Practice of the Militia of the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. No land shall be acquired by the
2 city of Boston for a ground or place for the par-
3 ade, drill and target practice of the militia of said
4 city under the provisions of section ninety of
5 chapter three hundred and sixty-seven of the acts
6 of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three,
7 prior to the first day of June in the year eighteen
8 hundred and ninety-nine.

1 SECTION 2. Any amount of money heretofore
2 voted and appropriated by the city of Boston in
3 compliance with the provisions of section ninety
4 of chapter three hundred and sixty-seven of the
5 acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-

6 three for the purpose of acquiring land by said
7 city for a ground or place for the parade, drill
8 and target practice of the militia of said city,
9 shall not be divided, used or applied for any other
10 purpose prior to the first day of June in the year
11 eighteen hundred and ninety-nine.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
