In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-eight,

AN ACT

Relative to the appointment of a Justice of the Peace in the City of Quincy, designated and commissioned to issue Warrants returnable to the District Court of East Norfolk in Criminal Cases, and take Bail therein.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The governor, with the advice and consent of
2 the council, may from time to time, upon the peti-
3 tion of the mayor of the city of Quincy, included
4 within the judicial district of the district court of
5 East Norfolk, designate and commission some
6 justice of the peace residing in said city of Quincy
7 who may issue warrants returnable to said court
8 in criminal cases arising within said judicial dis-
9 trict and take bail therein.
