SENATE, May 2, 1899.

The committee on Metropolitan Affairs, to whom was referred the bill relative to the laying out and construction of Bennington street and of other highways in the city of Boston (Senate, No. 100, introduced on leave); the petition of William J. Donovan for legislation to authorize the city of Boston to expend \$2,000,000 in laying out, locating anew, altering, widening and constructing highways not exceeding 50 feet in width (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 30); the petition of J. B. L. Bartlett for legislation relative to the construction of a boulevard from the corner of Blue Hill avenue and Morton street to Washington street at Forest Hills (accompanied by bill, House, No. 228); and the petition of John A. Sawyer for legislation to authorize the city of Boston to construct an extension of Malvern street in said city (accompanied by bill, House, No. 807), report the accompanying bill.
