AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in
the Office of the Insurance Commissioner.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber in the year nineteen hundred, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the insurance commissioner,
8 thirty-five hundred dollars. [Acts 1890, chap.
9 247.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$3,500.)

10 For the salary of the deputy insurance commis-
11 sioner, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Acts 1887,
12 chap. 214; 1888, chap. 84; 1895, chap. 81.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,500.)

13 For the salary of the actuary of the insurance

14 commissioner, two thousand dollars. [Acts 1895,
15 chapter 81.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,000.)

16 For the salary of the examiner in the insurance
17 department, two thousand dollars. [Acts 1896,
18 chap. 335.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,000.)

19 For the salary of the chief clerk of the insur-
20 commissioner, two thousand dollars. [Acts 1895,
21 chap. 81.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,000.)

22 For the salary of the second clerk of the insur-
23 ance commissioner, fifteen hundred dollars. [Acts
24 1895, chap. 81.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$1,500.)

25 For the salary of the third clerk of the insurance
26 commissioner, twelve hundred dollars. [Acts
27 1895, chap. 81.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$1,200.)

28 For such additional clerks and assistants as the
29 insurance commissioner may find necessary for
30 the despatch of public business, a sum not exceed-
31 ing twenty-three thousand three hundred dollars.

(Appropriation 1899, \$21,650.)

33 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
34 insurance commissioner, a sum not exceeding
35 thirty-five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stats., chap.

37 1888, chap. 84.]

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
