HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, Jan. 19, 1900.

The committee on Rules who were authorized to report from time to time rules for the government of the House and measures for expediting its business, report in part as follows:—

That Rule 100 be amended in the second clause by striking out all after the word “House,” in the third line, and inserting in place thereof the words:—unless upon a written request of a member addressed to the speaker and approved in writing by him, which request shall be surrendered upon the person entering upon the corridor, — so as to read as follows:—

“No person shall be admitted to the members’ corridor and adjoining rooms, except persons entitled to the privilege of the floor of the House, unless upon a written request of a member addressed to the speaker and approved in writing by him, which request shall be surrendered upon the person entering upon the corridor.”
