

HOUSE No. 739.

[Bill accompanying the petition of Benjamin Mullen. Liquor Law.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred.

AN ACT

To regulate the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors, also the
Premises upon which they are sold.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. No license of the first or fourth class
2 shall be granted for the sale of intoxicating or malt
3 liquors upon any premises other than a clear, regular,
4 continuous, and unbroken room, nor shall any porch,
5 vestibule, partition, hallway, ante-room, or any other
6 obstruction be maintained that will in any way whatso-
7 ever prevent a clear, full and unobstructed view of the
8 whole of the premises.

1 SECTION 2. Nor shall any entrance be made or main-
2 tained to any place where such intoxicating or malt
3 liquors are sold from any alley, lane, place, court, narrow

4 or ended street, or any place designated as a family en-
5 trance when the same is separated from the main room
6 for which a license has been granted for the sale of in-
7 toxicating liquor, even though said place, lane, or street
8 may be used as a means of reaching any residence that
9 may be located in or about said places.

1 SECTION 3. Nor shall any card, circular, pamphlet,
2 voting list or any other matter of a political nature be
3 displayed in or about any premises licensed for the sale
4 of spirituous, intoxicating or malt liquors.

1 SECTION 4. Nor shall any spirituous, intoxicating or
2 malt liquors be sold or given away to any person of no-
3 toriously intemperate habits, nor to any person on a
4 pass-book or order on a store, nor on a note for wages
5 due, nor in exchange for any goods, wares, merchandise
6 or provisions, nor to any unlicensed dealer in intoxicat-
7 ing liquors, nor to any keeper of any house of ill-fame,
8 nor to any woman to be drunk on the premises.

1 SECTION 5. Any person violating any of the first four
2 sections of this act shall be liable to have his license re-
3 voked.

1 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
