AN ACT

Relative to the Employment of Superintendents of Schools by Cities and Towns.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The school committee of each
2 town or city in the Commonwealth may and,
3 after July first, nineteen hundred and two, shall
4 employ at the expense of said town or city a
5 superintendent of schools, who, under the direc-
6 tion and control of said committee, shall have the
7 care and supervision of the public schools.

1 SECTION 2. The school committees of towns
2 whose valuation is less than two million five hun-
3 dred thousand dollars may and, after July first,
4 nineteen hundred and two, shall form unions
5 under the provisions of chapter four hundred and
6 sixty-six of the acts of the year eighteen hundred
7 and ninety-eight.

1 SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts incon-
2 sistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
3 repealed.
