## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred.

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### AN ACT

To provide for holding a Meeting of Members of  
Saint Joseph's Home in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. John J. Williams, Charles F.  
2 Donnelly and Patrick Donahoe, who are sole  
3 surviving members of Saint Joseph's Home, a  
4 corporation organized under chapter one hundred  
5 and eighty-five of the acts of the year eighteen  
6 hundred and sixty-seven and located in Boston,  
7 or the majority of them, are authorized to call and  
8 hold a meeting of said corporation at which new  
9 members and officers may be chosen, by-laws con-  
10 cerning meetings and elections be amended and  
11 general business transacted: *provided*, said meet-  
12 ing is called by a notice signed by a majority of  
13 said three members setting forth the time, place  
14 and purposes of such meeting, a copy of which

15 notice shall be delivered or mailed to all the mem-  
16 bers of said corporation at least seven days prior  
17 to the time appointed for such meeting.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
