### AN ACT

Relative to the Recording of Leases and Conditional  
Sales of Personal property.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 No sale of personal property made on condition  
2 that the title to the property sold shall not pass  
3 until the price is paid in full, except all articles  
4 of household furniture and personal adornment,  
5 musical instruments, books, pictures and other  
6 articles of personal property exempt from levy on  
7 execution under the provisions of chapter one  
8 hundred and seventy-one of the Public Statutes,  
9 shall be valid against any person other than the  
10 parties thereto, unless a memorandum of said sale  
11 is recorded in the manner provided in section one  
12 of chapter one hundred and ninety-two of the  
13 Public Statutes.
