AN ACT

To authorize the Greenfield Electric Light and Power Company to transact Business in the Towns of Shelburne, Buckland and Conway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Greenfield Electric Light and
2 Power Company, situated in Greenfield, is hereby
3 authorized, upon the approval of the board of gas
4 and electric light commissioners, to carry on any
5 or all branches of its business, other than the sale
6 of electricity for light or power, in Shelburne,
7 Buckland and Conway, or in any one or more of
8 said towns, with all the rights, powers and privi-
9 leges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities
10 in said Shelburne, Buckland and Conway, now or
11 hereafter conferred or imposed by law upon such
12 corporations.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
