AN ACT

To establish the Rank of the Judge Advocate-General as Brigadier-General.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section one of chapter three hun-
- 2 dred and fifty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen
- 3 hundred and ninety-eight is hereby amended by
- 4 striking out in the third line thereof the word
- 5 "and," and by adding after the words "in-
- 6 spector-general," in the third line thereof, the
- 7 words: and a judge advocate-general, and
- 8 also by striking out in the fifth line thereof the
- 9 words "judge advocate-general," so that said
- 10 section as amended shall read as follows: -

11 Section 1. The staff of the commander-in12 chief shall consist of an adjutant-general, who
13 shall, ex-officio, be chief of staff; a surgeon14 general, an inspector-general and a judge advo15 cate-general, each with the rank of brigadier16 general; a quartermaster-general, a commissary17 general and an inspector-general of rifle-practice,
18 each with the rank of colonel; an assistant adju19 tant-general and six assistant inspectors-general,
20 each with the rank of lieutenant-colonel; an
21 assistant quartermaster-general and four aides22 de-camp, each with the rank of major.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its 2 passage.
