AN ACT

To authorize the County Commissioners of the County of Berkshire to pay a Sum of Money to the Widow of Dempster J. Coleman.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of the
2 county of Berkshire are hereby authorized to pay
3 to the widow of Dempster J. Coleman, late clerk
4 of the district court of southern Berkshire, who
5 died on the tenth day of February in the year
6 nineteen hundred, the sum of six hundred and
7 twenty-two dollars and twenty-seven cents, being
8 the amount which said Dempster J. Coleman
9 would have been entitled to receive if he had
10 lived and continued to serve as such clerk until
11 the end of the current year.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
