RESOLUTIONS

On the Death of Roger Wolcott.

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives desire to express their sense of the loss which
3 Massachusetts has suffered in the death of Roger Wol-
4 cott, formerly governor of the Commonwealth, lieutenant
5 governor and a representative in the general court.

6 Scholarly, high-minded, and endowed with a chivalrous
7 sense of honor and duty, he won distinction and respect
8 in business affairs and in affairs of State. A leader in
9 this Commonwealth, which has never lacked eminent
10 men, he always enjoyed the confidence and affection of
11 its citizens to an extraordinary degree. His career in
12 public and in private life is an example which cannot fail
13 to help the growing youth as well as the matured man,
14 and the memory of his spotless, upright and useful life
15 will go down to posterity as an example in patriotism
16 and an inspiration to nobility of purpose.

17 *Resolved*, That these resolutions be entered on the
18 journals of the two houses and that an engrossed copy of
19 the same be sent to the bereaved family, to whom, in
20 their deep affliction, the sincere sympathy of the senate
21 and of the house and of the people of the entire Common-
22 wealth is respectfully tendered.
