AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses of the State Board of Insanity.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber in the year nineteen hundred and one, to
7 wit:—

8 For travelling and office expenses of the state
9 board of insanity, a sum not exceeding five thou-
10 sand dollars. [Acts 1898, chap. 433.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$5,000.)

11 For salaries of officers and employees of the
12 state board of insanity, a sum not exceeding four-
13 teen thousand seven hundred dollars. [Acts
14 1898, chap. 433.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$12,900.)

15 For transportation and medical examination of
16 state paupers under the charge of the state board
17 of insanity, eight thousand five hundred dollars.
18 [Acts 1898, chap. 433.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$12,000.)

19 For the support of insane paupers boarded out
20 in families, under the charge of the state board of
21 insanity, eight thousand dollars. [Acts 1885,
22 chap. 385; 1898, chap. 433.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$7,000.)
