### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for sundry miscellaneous  
Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for  
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-  
6 ber in the year nineteen hundred and one, to  
7 wit: —

8 For the payment of unclaimed moneys in the  
9 hands of receivers of certain insolvent corpora-  
10 tions, after the same have been deposited in the  
11 treasury of the Commonwealth, a sum not exceed-  
12 ing fifteen hundred dollars. [Acts 1883, chap.  
13 258; 1886, chap. 300.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$3,000.)

14 To carry out the provisions of the act relative

15 to the payment from the treasury of the Common-  
16 wealth of funds received from public adminis-  
17 trators, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.  
18 [Acts 1883, chap. 264.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$4,000.)

19 For medical examiners' fees, a sum not exceed-  
20 ing five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stats., chap. 26;  
21 Acts 1887, chap. 310.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$500.)

22 For expenses incurred in the construction and  
23 repair of roads in the town of Mashpee during  
24 the year nineteen hundred, the sum of three hun-  
25 dred dollars. [Acts 1870, chap. 293, sect. 5.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$300.)

26 For assistance to the town of Truro in main-  
27 taining a section of its county highway known as  
28 Beach Point road, a sum not exceeding five hun-  
29 dred dollars. [Acts 1891, chap. 363.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$500.)

30 For the city of Waltham, for the annual assess-  
31 ment due from the Commonwealth towards main-  
32 taining and operating a system of sewage dis-  
33 posal at the Massachusetts school for the feeble-  
34 minded, the sum of eight hundred twenty dollars  
35 and eighty-nine cents, as provided for in section  
36 three of chapter eighty-three of the acts of the  
37 year eighteen hundred and ninety-three.

38 For the support of Sarah J. Robinson, a pris-  
39 oner in the jail at Lowell, a sum not exceeding  
40 four hundred dollars. [Res. 1889, chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$400.)

41 For the compensation of probation officers, as

42 authorized by section seven of chapter three hun-  
43 dred and fifty-six of the acts of the year eighteen  
44 hundred and ninety-one, a sum not exceeding  
45 twelve hundred dollars.

(Appropriation 1900, \$1,100.)

46 For small items of expenditure for which no  
47 appropriations have been made or for which ap-  
48 propriations have been exhausted or reverted to  
49 the treasury of the Commonwealth in previous  
50 years, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars,  
51 to be expended under the direction of the auditor  
52 of the Commonwealth.

53 For travelling and other necessary expenses of  
54 the trustees of the Lyman and Industrial schools,  
55 a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars. [Acts  
56 1895, chap. 428.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$1,000.)

57 For the payment of expenses of the state board  
58 of bar examiners, as authorized by chapter three  
59 hundred and twelve of the acts of the year eigh-  
60 teen hundred and ninety-eight, a sum not exceed-  
61 ing fifteen hundred dollars.

(Appropriation 1900, \$1,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
